The EEC becomes the European Community (EC). The Treaty on European Union (EU Treaty) is signed on 7 February 1992 and enters into force on 1 November 1993.



## Frederick the Great at Peace--Not Germany

POTSDAM, Germany — The remains of Frederick the Great were returned to his beloved Sans Souci palace Saturday for burial alongside his faithful greyhounds, fulfilling the Prussian king's last wish 205 years late in a Germany still wrestling with the militaristic image that was his legacy.

Unification of the two Germanys made the kings' final journey possible from the ancestral castle of the Hohenzollern dynasty in the south to the rococo Sans Souci in what used to be the Communist east. There's a famous legend about the origin of chess that goes like this. When the inventor of the game showed it to the emperor of India, the emperor was so impressed by the new game, that he said to the man

"Name your reward!"

The man responded,

*"Oh emperor, my wishes are simple. I only wish for this. Give me one grain of rice for the first square of the chessboard, two grains for the next square, four for the next, eight for the next and so on for all 64 squares, with each square having double the number of grains as the square before."*

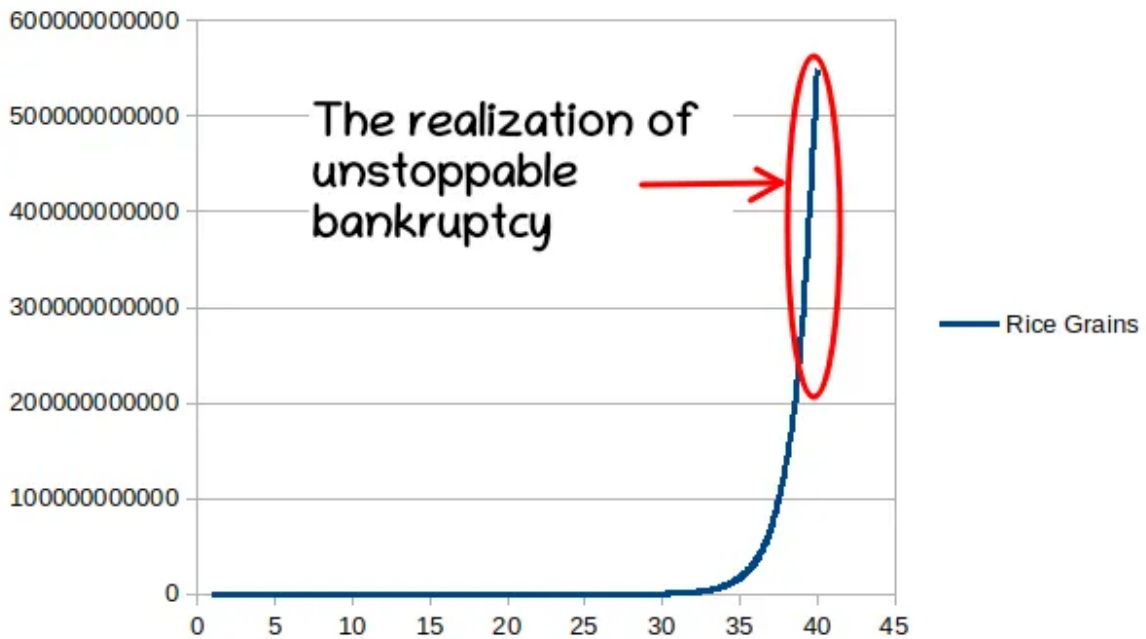
The emperor agreed, amazed that the man had asked for such a small reward - or so he thought. After a week, his treasurer came back and informed him that the reward would add up to an astronomical sum, far greater than all the rice that could conceivably be produced in many many centuries!

Put simply, the inventor of the chess game scammed the kingdom out of all its wealth by understanding the nature of exponential growth.



From the chart above, you can see how the grains of rice took off into the stratosphere and destroyed the kingdom. However, the kingdom was probably already bankrupt by the 35<sup>th</sup> square. This looks like nothing on the chart, but that is how exponential growth works:



This parable illustrates a simple power law at play. However, this is not just a parable, our world becomes much more understandable when we see the world through the

eyes of power laws.

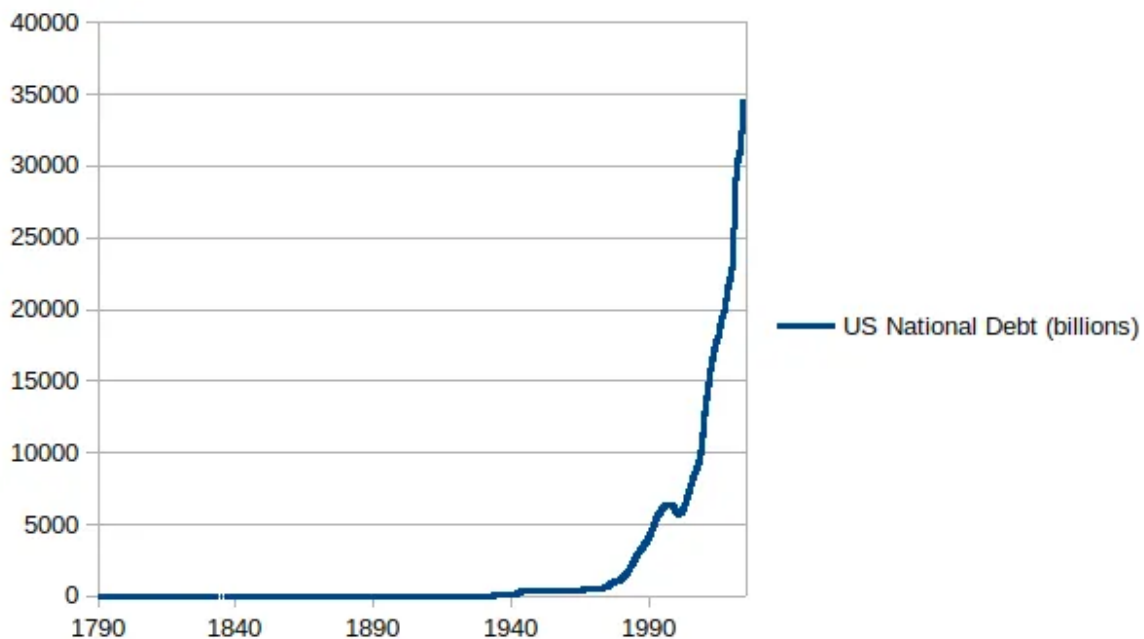


# We've discovered a new rule of nature. It explains why animals' pointy parts grow the way they do

This is a "power law", in which there's a straight-line relationship between a tooth's width and length when you take a logarithm of these measurements. Power laws are also found in the sizes of earthquakes, extinction rates of animals and movements of the stock market.

In the parable, the Indian emperor agreed to the contract of rice delivery because he thought that the amount he owed to the Chessboard inventor was insignificant. He failed to understand the compounding effect of the power law he had agreed to, and in very short order he was bankrupted by a contract for rice delivery.

With respect to the growth of America's national debt, it has an eerily similar trajectory to the Indian emperor's rice obligations. This applies to governments throughout the world and it is facilitated by their respective central banks.

The emperor would have needed to resort to exorbitant taxation to maintain his rice deliveries. Taxation delayed the emperor's bankruptcy, but it would never have stopped the event from happening because the rate of rice delivery grew exponentially. Today, the burden to service and pay back the national debt falls squarely on tax paying citizens through income taxes, property taxes, death taxes, exit taxes, and now carbon taxes. Similar to the rice parable, the debt is rising at an exponential rate, so that taxation cannot stop bankruptcy, but only delay it.

Is there any way out of this debt trap? After all, very few people today were alive when the system we live in today came into being. To address this question, we will take a closer look at how events transpired in the final days of the deceived Indian emperor.

## The Great Rice Contract

Let's assume, for the sake of a mind excursion, that the chess inventor's intention was always to deceive, bankrupt, and eventually control the great Indian empire. While this may sound ridiculous, the emperor agreed to his contract, and therefore the inventor was now in a position to do exactly that. While he understood the power law of compounding debt, it would only be a matter of time before the emperor and his counsel worked out that they were facing annihilation if they kept paying the little

The first few deliveries were a bit of a joke. The royal guards delivered first 1 grain, then 2 grains, then 4 grains of rice. As a symbol of gratitude, the inventor said he would pay the guards half of his rice deliveries, which was literally nothing. However, this developed a nice rapport between the guards and the inventor. It meant nothing to the inventor, because he knew he was getting 4 times as many rice grains than the guards in the following 6 months.

This went on for a few years, but by the end of year 5, the chess inventor had 1,000,000 grains of rice delivered to his house. He dutifully gave half of the delivery back to the guards, and said he was looking forward to the 2,000,000 rice delivery 3 months later. By the end of that year, 8,000,000 grains of rice was due for payment, and the royal guards would receive 4,000,000 of that payment.

Shit was starting to get real, and the Royal treasurer noticed that not only were the rice silos low, but also that the market price of rice was rising due to scarcity. It was

nothing to be majorly worried about at the time, but the treasurer decided to levy a rice tax on the growers so that the royal silos could be kept full. One of the royal guards overheard the treasurer talking about the rice shortage, and he told the humble inventor about the events going on in the palace.

The chess inventor requested a private meeting with the treasurer, who accepted his invitation. He said that at the end of the year he needed 134 million grains of rice delivered, as per the agreed rice contract. Stunned, the treasurer said that this was a ridiculous request, especially considering the scarcity of rice and its enormous price rise over the last year. The chess inventor was unphased, and repeated his request, but suggested he would pay the Treasurer 1,000,000 grains of rice every 3 months if he continued to fulfil the *Great Rice Contract*.

This was tempting, but the treasurer still refused. The Chess inventor then told the treasurer that their were 1,000 guards being paid by him. One of the guards revealed to the treasurer that they had proof of his infidelity with little boys in the palace, and that if he did not comply, his crimes would be revealed to the emperor and result in instant death. The royal treasurer, now pale white, then agreed he would carry out the wishes of the inventor.

Blackmailed, the treasurer began rapidly increasing taxation across the empire. This was not just in rice, but everything they could possibly tax. Income tax, death tax, rice tax, etc.... At this stage, the emperor was unaware of what was transpiring, and was too busy playing chess and enjoying parties with the beautiful women in his palace. The treasurer and a small cabal of royal guards, however, knew what was transpiring right before their eyes.

The empire began to experience popular uprisings as the people were impoverished by the taxes and extreme scarcity of rice in the kingdom. # A Parallel Parable Today?

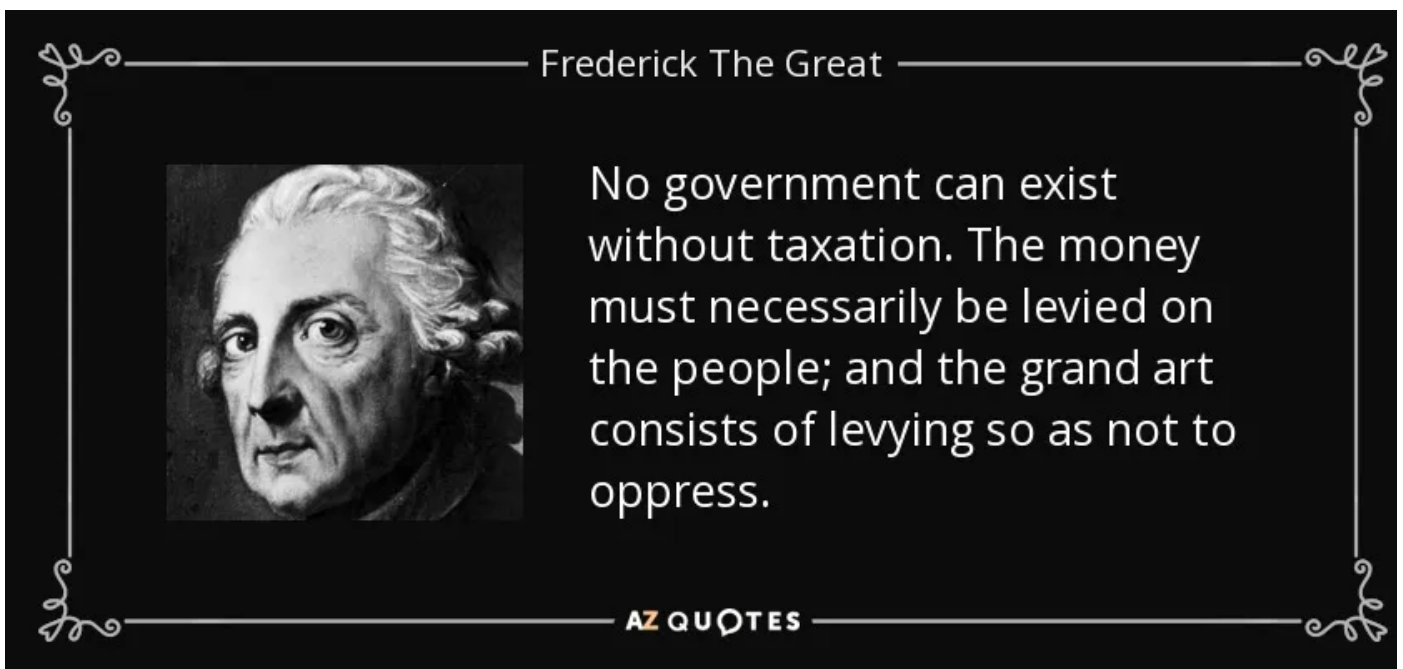
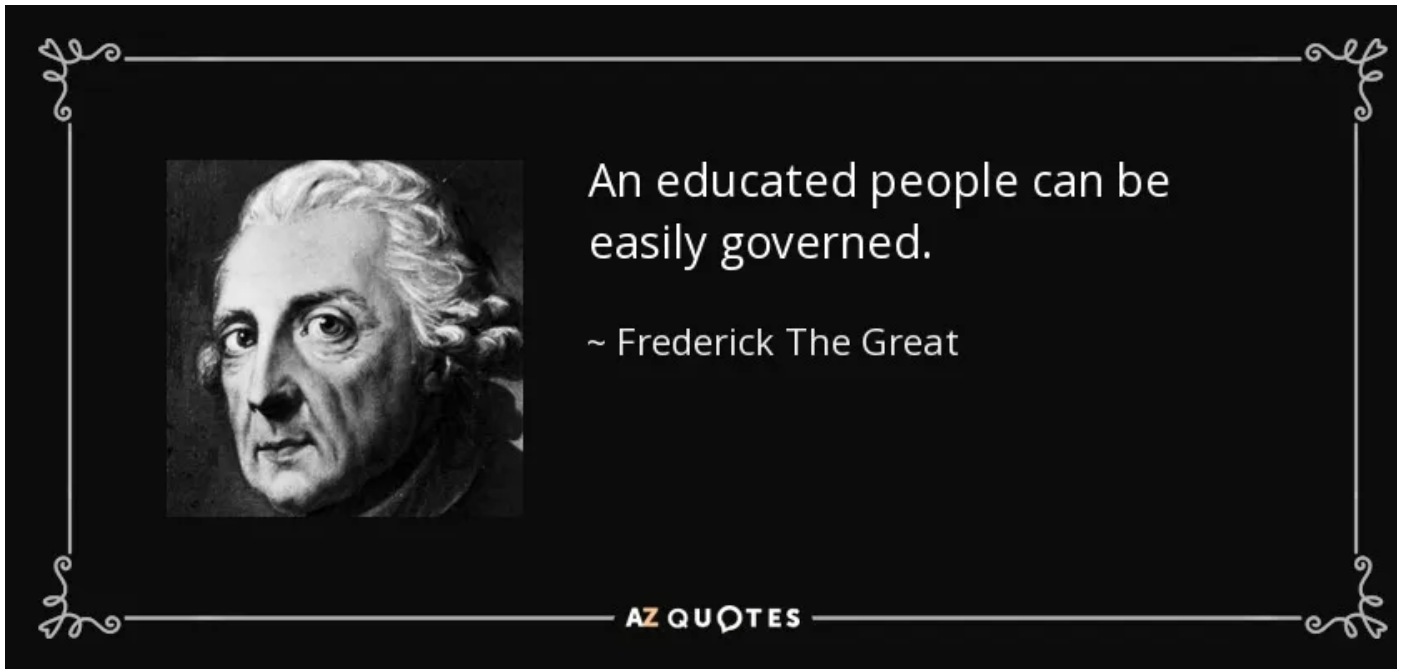
