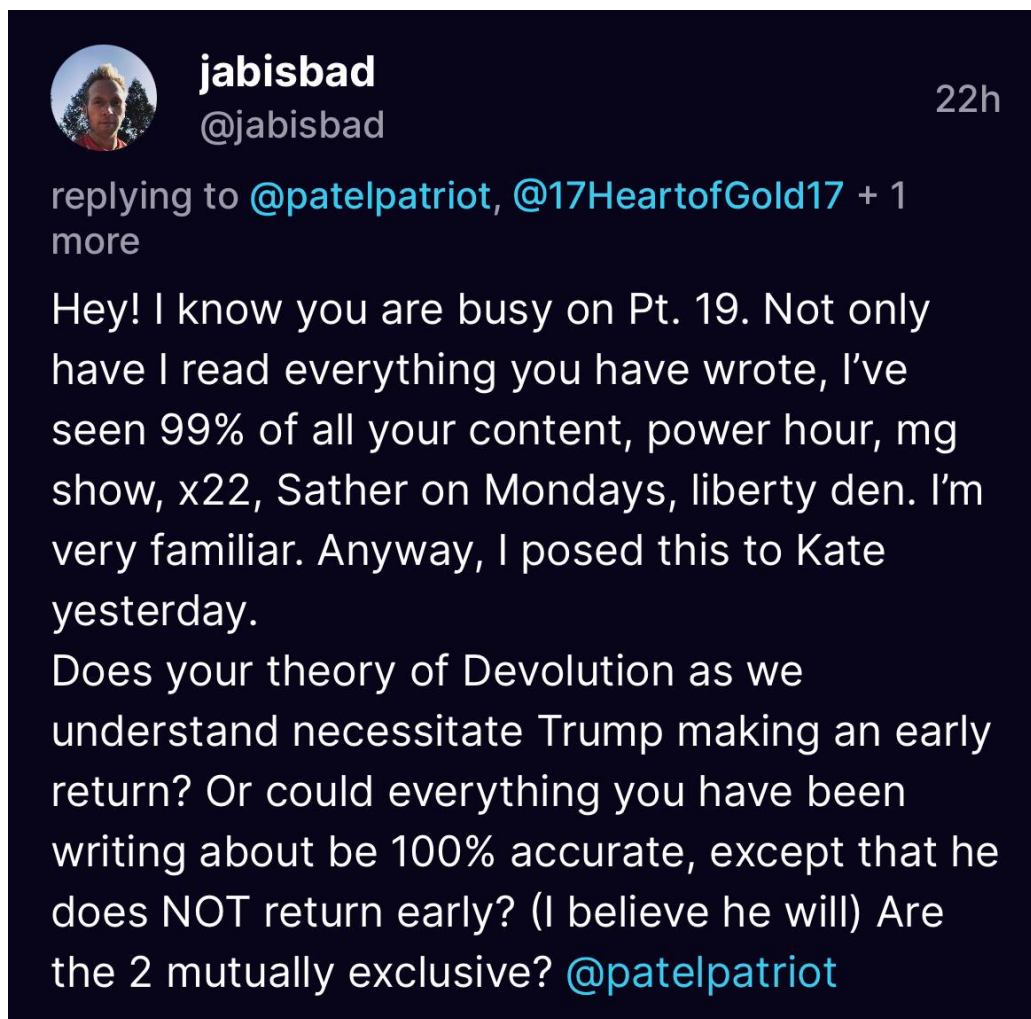
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There is a question I keep getting so it's time I answer it properly. Here is the question as asked by @jabisbad on Truth Social:



Does devolution require Trump returning as President?

To answer this we need to understand exactly what a continuity of government plan accomplishes. Two of my favorite documents to refer to regarding continuity of government are:

These pamphlets outline the Army's COOP program and planning procedures. Combined they mention the word "Devolution" 60 times.

Here is the definition of COOP:

Continuity of operations

An internal effort within each agency/organization to ensure essential functions continue to be performed during disruption of normal operations.

The “disruption of normal operations” was the theft of the 2020 election involving a foreign government and (if you read [Devolution - Part 19](#)) transnational criminal organizations.

Here is the definition of Devolution:

Devolution

The transfer of statutory authority and responsibilities for performance of MEFs from an organization’s primary operating staff to other employees internal or external to the organization in order to sustain essential functions for an extended period. Devolution is a continuity option used instead of, or in conjunction with, relocation in order to ensure the continued performance of essential functions.

As I discussed in [Devolution - Part 13](#), Trump issued [Executive Order 13961](#) and this was how he implemented and executed Devolution. Here is a recap of that Executive Order from Part 13:

Let’s do another recap quick:

- On December 7th, 2020, Trump issued the FMR EO using his Presidential powers based in the context of War & National Defense.
- The FMR EO explains that it is the policy of the United States to perform the NEFs as defined by PPD-40, in a continuity environment, regardless of threat or condition.
- The Federal Continuity Directives gave us those NEFs.
- The FMR EO explains the switch from a reactive posture to a proactive posture when it comes to continuity planning, making it seem like they may have know what was coming.
- The FMR EO established an Executive Committee to implement and execute a continuity plan.
- The FMR EO has detailed the roles of the Executive Committee and established that the Executive Committee could establish subordinate bodies and working groups to support their work in implementing and executing the continuity plan.

At the same time that he issued Executive Order 13961, he issued the [Federal Mission Resilience Strategy](#). This screenshot from Devolution - Part 13 outlines a small part of what this Strategy was supposed to do:

The Strategy outlines the context, planning model, and steps necessary to ensure the resilience of the Federal executive branch. It includes:

- Re-prioritization of essential functions.
- Increasing possible nodes available to perform those re-prioritized essential functions.
- Mentions throughout the distributed environment of operations across geographic areas.

The FMR EO and the Strategy paint a clear picture of devolution. A plan to create an Executive Committee of senior level officials and subordinate bodies or working groups that would be proactively ready to take on the authority and responsibility of performing the re-prioritized essential functions required to preserve our American way of life.

The Devolution series is chock-full of evidence that devolution was initiated. To understand how the rest of the devolution plan unfolds, we need to look at the 4 phases of a continuity plan (the notes in red are my own):

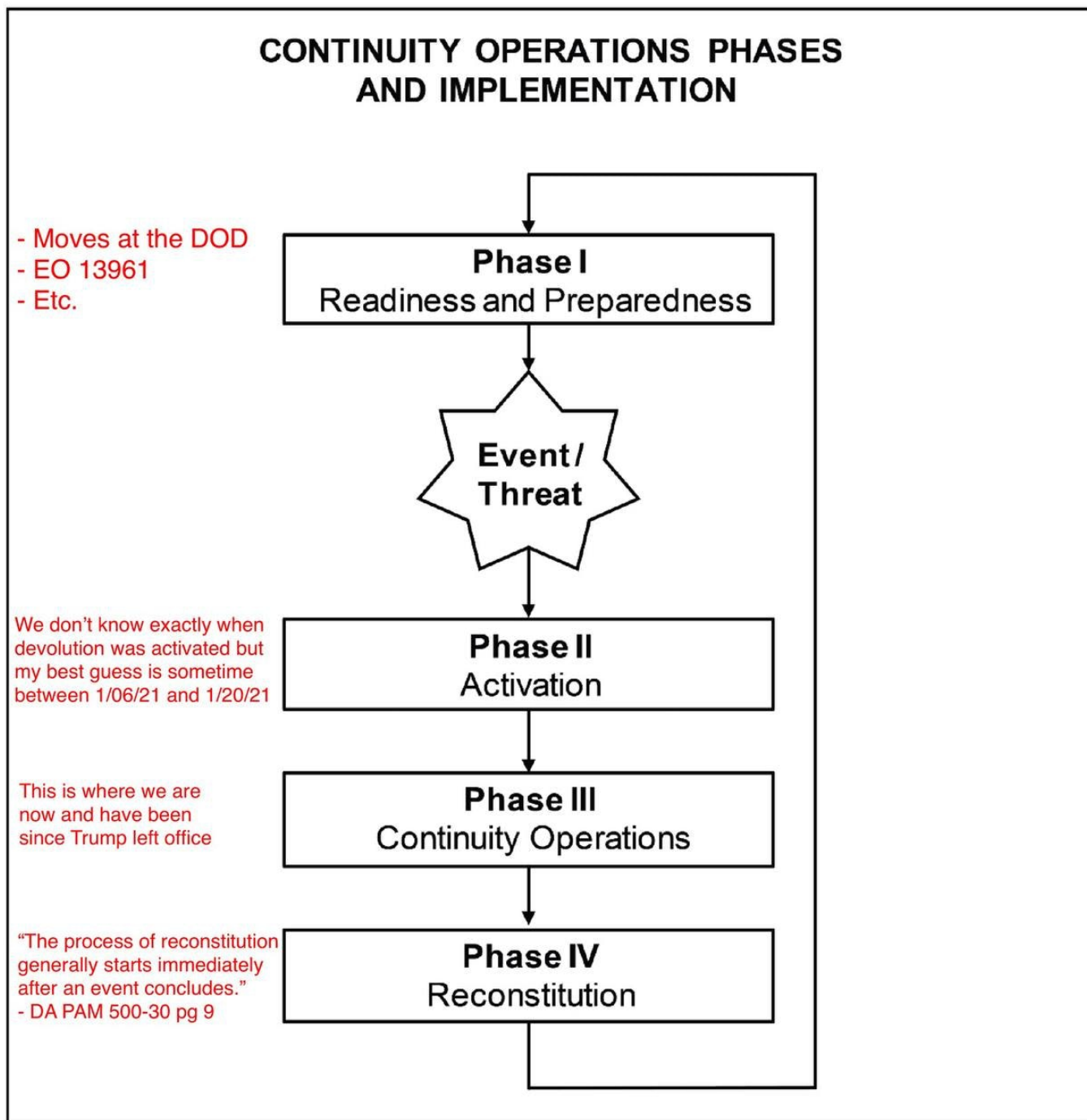


Figure 3-1. Continuity operations phases and implementation

I could be convinced that EO 13961 was part of the activation. It's hard to know the exact timeline of when Trump officially made his moves but the above figure from AR-PAM 500-30 should give you a good idea the overall concept of devolution.

We are currently in Phase 3 and we don't move on to Phase 4 until "immediately after an event concludes". Nobody knows what that conclusion will look like but that is what we are waiting for.

This is the description of Reconstitution:

3–11. Reconstitution

Reconstitution is the final phase of a continuity event and is the process by which surviving and/or replacement personnel resume normal operations. Reconstitution may occur at any designated location that provides the staff, facilities, and systems necessary to sustain essential functions and activities to resume normal operations. Reconstitution activities re-establish noncritical missions, functions, organizations, resources, and services as they existed prior to the crisis event. Reconstitution is a combination of personnel, facilities, and IT systems and equipment actions taken to rebuild or replace the staff, facilities, and communications and IT capabilities as soon as possible after an event. As an element of continuity, reconstitution concurrently supports sustainment of MEFs while managing the resumption of normal operations. Since reconstitution activities should begin as soon as possible after a continuity event, the organization's COOP OPLAN will identify a reconstitution team by organization and position including the leadership, staff, and resources dedicated and separate from existing continuity support. In most cases, extensive coordination will be necessary to repair or rebuild the original facility or procure a new operating facility, backfill staff, reestablish communications and IT infrastructure, restore essential records, and take other actions to return the organization to normal operations. The organization's COOP OPLAN will—

The key phrase from above is “resume normal operations” and this phrase is one of the reasons I believe Trump comes back as part of the devolution plan. The “normal operations” before devolution was initiated had Trump as the President of the United States. Therefore, returning to “normal operations” would mean we would be returning to operations that had Trump as President of the United States.

The reasoning above is just solely based on language and definition found regarding continuity of government and continuity of operations. There are plenty other reasons to believe Trump will return. It's not in his character to walk away from something when he was the rightful winner. Just last week Trump unendorsed Mo Brooks because Mo said we need to “put that behind you” when referring to the 2020 election fraud:

Any Trump "return" will have to be constitutionally sanctioned. He can't just waltz back into the White House without that, for a critical reason: legitimacy. Trump made his farewell speech in the early morning of January 20th, saying he was "leaving" and that he would "be back very soon". This plants the seed in the mind of the nation that what we normally see on inauguration day was status

quo this time too: Trump "left", Byeden "fauxnaugurated". Trump openly refers to the "byeden administration", as does all media, and has since 1/20/21. This gives the nation the air that byeden is currently "president". So any Trump restoration prior to a 2024 November election will have to follow strict adherence to what is constitutionally permitted. That substantially limits acceptable scenarios. And it would almost have to include SCOTUS rendering a decision in regard to it. Which means Trump is going to have to engage in a court case to prove the massive fraud he's been talking about non-stop since early 2020. He has to follow a constitutional path back to the presidency, otherwise he'll be seen as illegitimate. He cannot ignore or overthrow the constitution he'll have to swear to uphold.
